This evidence and practice-informed workshop, influenced by voices of children and young people, is an opportunity to promote ways of working between agencies across London to support young people to feel safe in education and surface some of the system challenges for children and young people.

This workshop will explore;

- > What are young people saying?
- > How are colleagues across London working together to respond to some of these challenges?
- > What does this mean for my agency and safeguarding partnerships across London as we think about how we work together to reduce system challenges for young people?

This participative workshop will provide opportunities for connecting with peers, learning together, and exploring new approaches to working with young people at risk of exclusion and exploitation.
